A DASTOOR WHO TENDS ANOTHER KIND OF FIRE

Mehernosh F. Dastoor, son of Fali Dastoor the former Chief Fire Officer of Ahmedabad continues the family tradition of Fire fighting.

At 42 years he is already the Deputy Chief Fire Officer of the Fire & Emergency Services and the only certified International trainer in India, in the SAVER methodology.

He passed out from the Nagpur National Fire Service College with honours and all other officers' courses with the same distinction. He has received many state and central government medals and awards for bravery and meritorious services.



The Earthquake of 2001 in Gujarat was a turning point for his career. Having worked round the clock and having saved hundreds of trapped people with the meagre means available to them. Leaving his own family behind in these terror filled days, he was gone for days busy rescuing others.

Being a fireman in India is not an easy job. You have practically no tools available to you. You are called in for any kind of emergency or security purpose. The general public does not have any value for the risk you put your life in on their behalf. Even the basic training that they undergo does not prepare them for the kind of emergencies that may arise. Especially, in an area and city like Ahmedabad with its chemical factories and surrounding refineries.

Soon after the earthquake many foreign countries and donors realised the plight of the

fire services and offered to help. Cordaid a Dutch NGO offered funds to a Dutch agency namely ICET (Internation Centre for Emergency Techniques) to train and equip the Ahmedabad Fire Department.

A selection of the men was made; Mehernosh Dastoor played an important role in coordinating this whole process with help from The Netherlands Business Support Office in Ahmedabad.

24 men from the Ahmedabad Fire Brigade were trained in the Netherlands and Germany along with some colleagues from other Gujarati cities, some doctors and traffic police men. 11 of these men certified as trainers and passed on their skills to their colleagues on

their return. Of these 11, Mehernosh was the only one to certify internationally.
